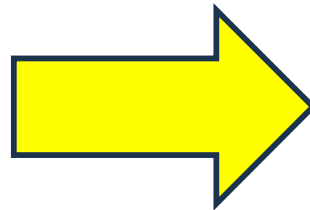


Background on Sustainable Procurement



Updated Sustainable Procurement Policy

- Principle based
- Missing alignment with Climate Change Action Plan, Indigenous Relations and EDI initiatives
- Inconsistent application
- Hard to measure
- No significant updates to-date



- Direction based
- New supporting menu containing criteria for MVA and HVAs
- Clearly aligns with environmental, Indigenous and social priorities
- Consistent application of criteria
- Measurable
- More accountability

New tool developed in-house aligned with strategic priorities

Commodity based

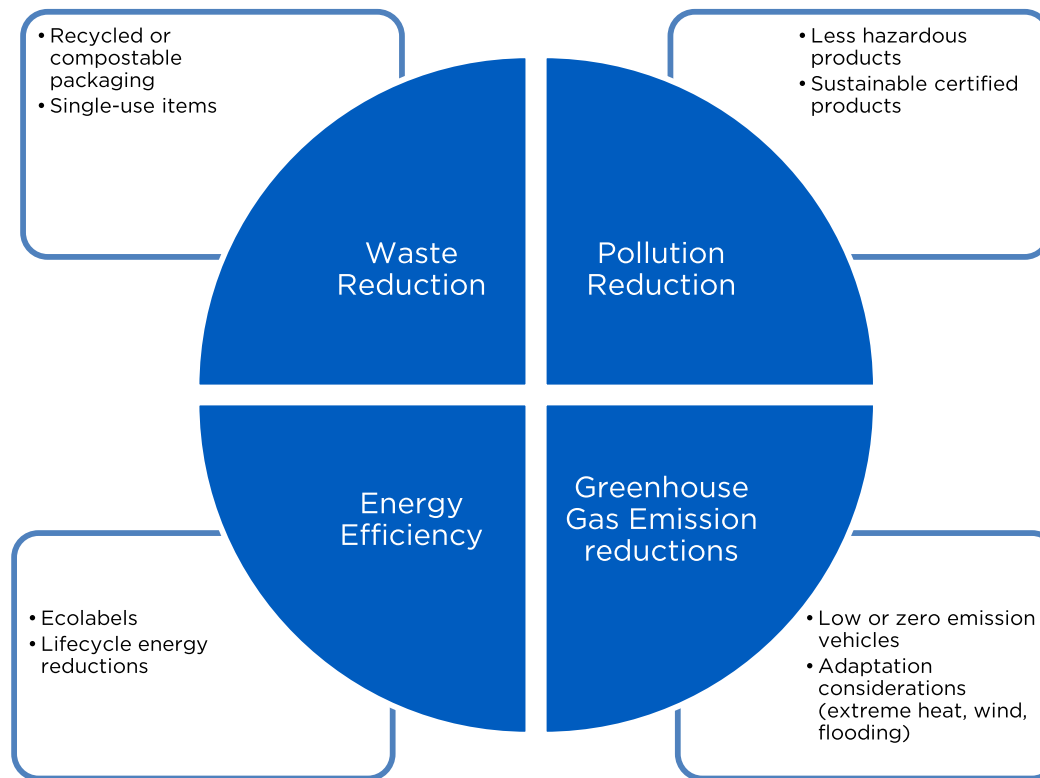
Used by Contract Managers, validated by Buyers

Applies to Medium and High Value evaluated procurements and where requirements are stated

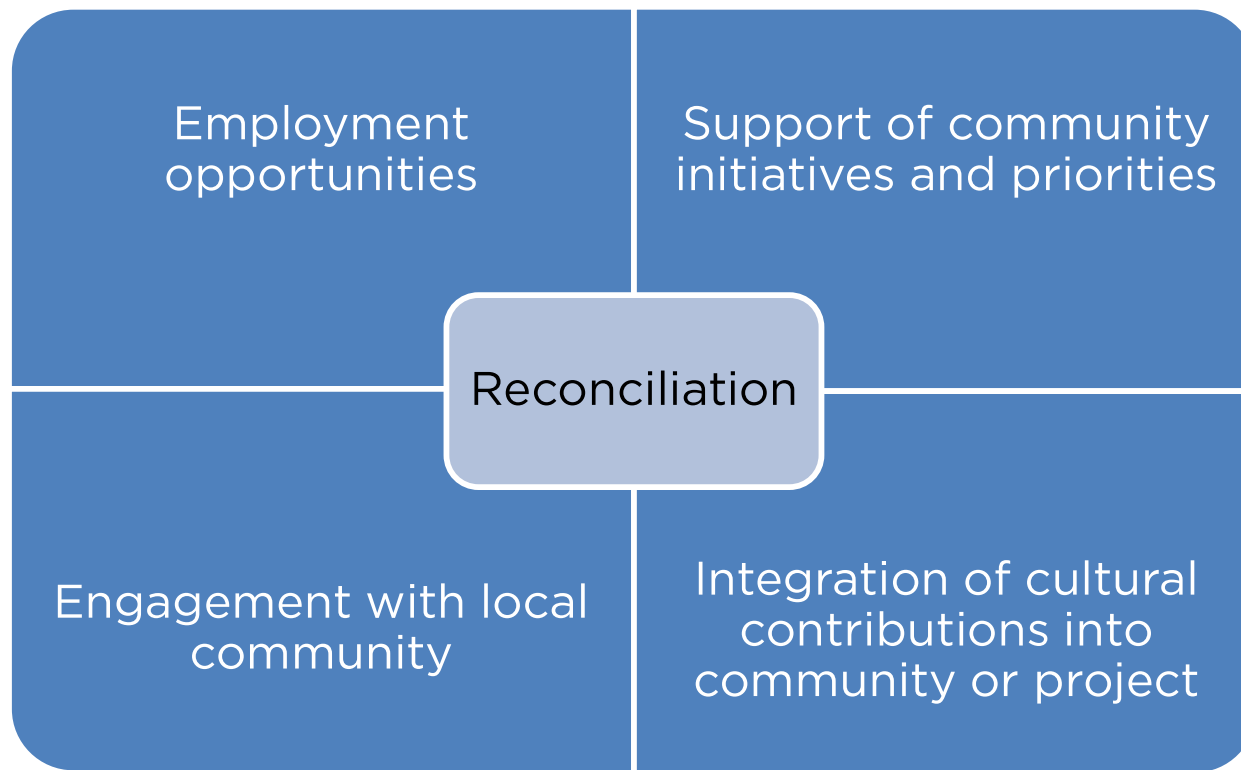
Guidance on review and evaluation of bid submissions

- Use of small businesses, social enterprise or diverse-owned businesses as suppliers and subcontractors

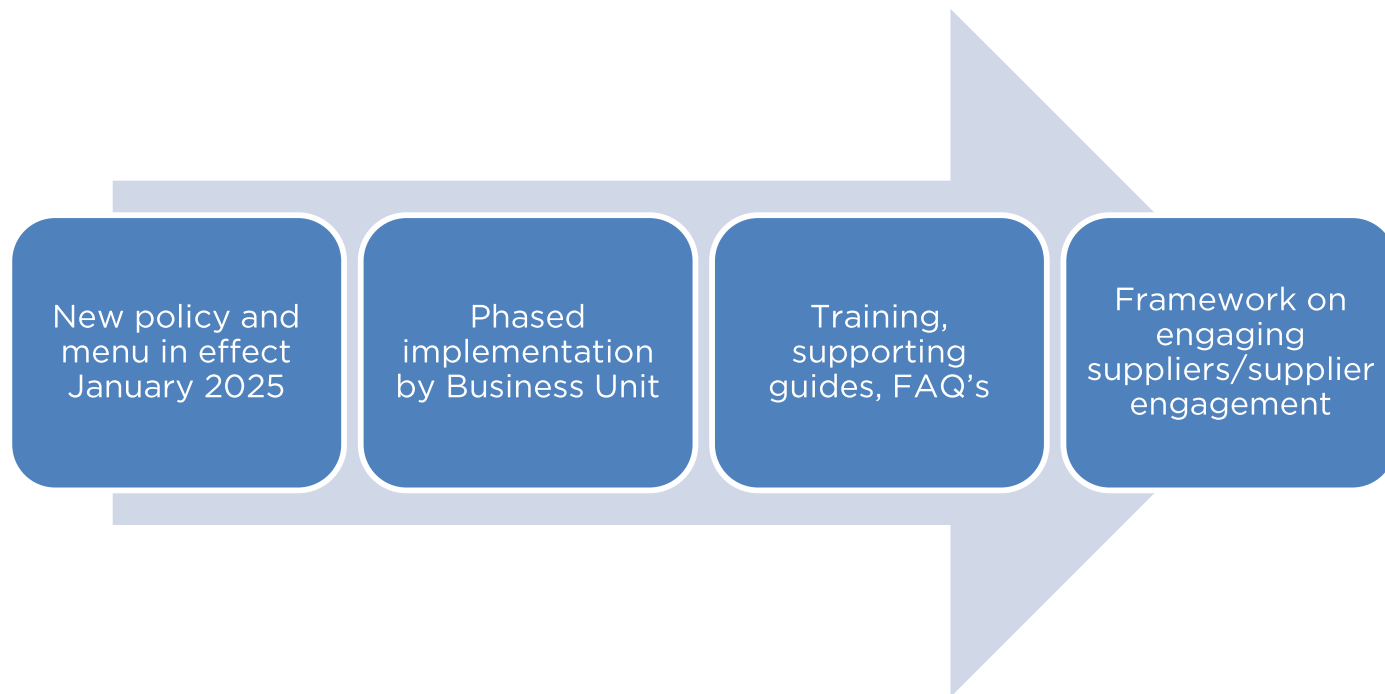
Skills and Training/Workforce development
