- Set a high watermark for other developments



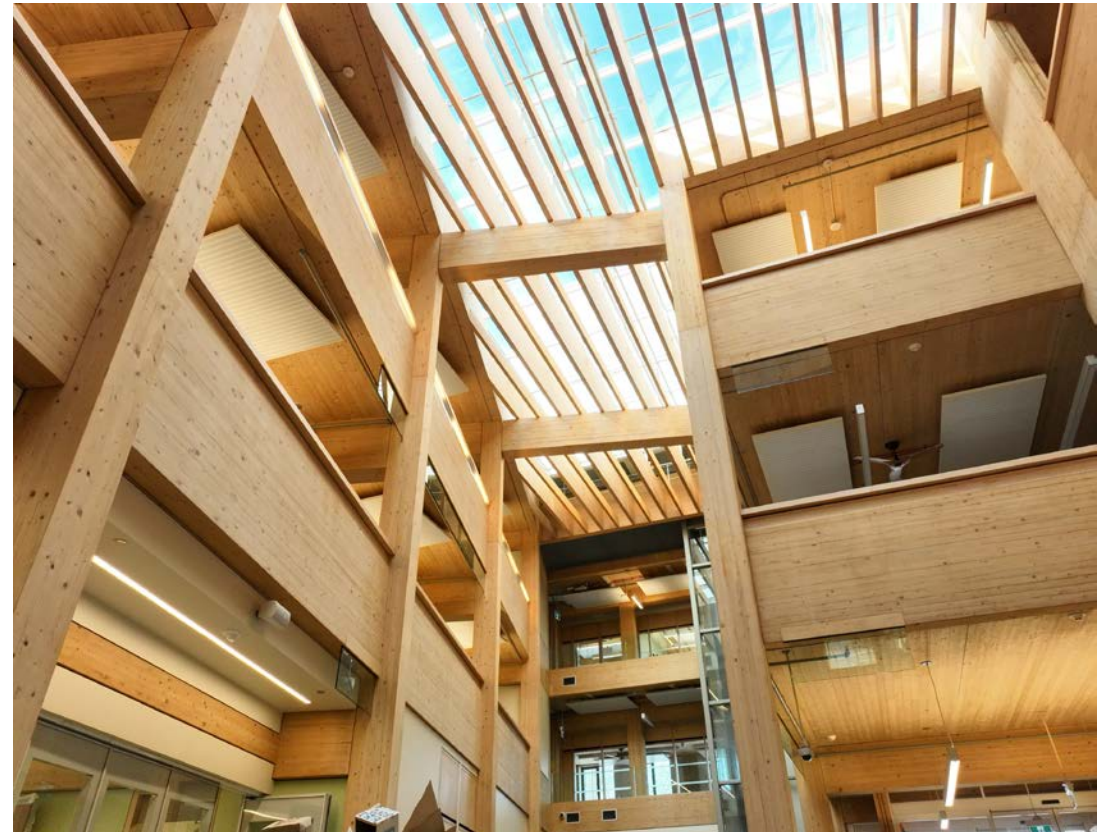
Key Sustainability Features
